## Plain Prototyping



The important thing about plain prototyping? This approach lets you concentrate on the basics of your idea: the shape, the purpose and the technical features. You should not get lost in the decoration! That means, you are only allowed to use colourless materials.

## What you need:

- All sort of scrap material (important that these are white and/or colourless with no text on it!)
  - e.g. paper, rope, straws, cardboard, used yoghurt cups, toilet rolls, ..
  - in the best case, you use garbage and/or things you find in your home or school!
- Tape, scissor, glue or glue guns (if available)

No (coloured) pens allowed!

Just focus on your imagination.
